## The Quest to Greece, the Land Where It All Started

As part of continuing efforts to enrich the lives of undergraduate members, this summer Richmond sent two groups of SigEps from all over the nation to Greece to explore the roots of the SigEp concepts of The Balanced Man and SoundMind/SoundBody, hallmarks of the modern SigEp organization.

Launched in 2001, the Alpha group of SigEps comprised six undergraduates and two mentors who piggybacked on a Greek study-tour organized by the University of North Carolina.

This year, the fraternity and the SigEp Educational Foundation sponsored two groups of six — the Beta and Gamma groups. The second of the two trips this past May included our own Conrad Eberstein '65 as the alumni mentor.

The Quest to Greece was born in the late 1990s as a result of a question posed at a meeting of the alumni faculty at a Carlson Leadership Academy. Tom Lynch, Penn State '90, chair of Richmond's National Leadership Committee, was looking for new ideas to inspire undergraduate achievement and to support the fraternity's mission of "Building Balanced Leaders for the World's Communities."

"Why not organize a summer trip to Greece and show a group of undergraduates where much of what SigEp stands for got started," Conrad suggested.

Obvious good idea, it seemed.

In his customary manner, Conrad quietly assisted then-undergraduate National Board member Matt Matlack

(Columbia '01) in setting up parameters for the trip, but could not accompany the first group. This year, however, Conrad spent 17 days in the company of "an outstandingly interesting and committed group of six undergraduates" from six different chapters.

"I was a mentor, not a monitor," said Conrad. "And I had a wonderful time watching young minds expand as these younger SigEps walked in the paths of the ancients and experienced fraternity on an entirely new level." Concepts of virtue, diligence and brotherly love came alive in a way not heretofore imagined by any of the six.

"The trip was engaging, both physically and intellectually. We walked down the 11-mile Samaria Gorge on Crete, the longest gorge in Europe, and walked up to the Acropolis in Athens to speak with the spirit of Aristotle, the father of a balanced life," said Conrad.

"I saw the wheels turning, heard the questions in formation, and witnessed the transformation into

fuller adulthood of six undergraduates, who I know have become friends for their lifetimes," he said.

The Quest to Greece is a priceless gift of membership in SigEp. Supported by contributions to the Sigma Phi Epsilon Educational Foundation, the Quest brings together some of our finest undergraduate brothers and engages them in a thoughtful study-tour of one of the major touchstones of fraternal and Western culture.

# The Road Less Traveled

Frank J. Carillo '78: Consulting with a Human Touch

Frank Carillo '78 grew up in Oradell, N.J., and, if not for a rejection by Princeton, he might have remained a Jersey boy. As luck would have it, Frank came to Penn, graduating from the Wharton School in 1978 with a degree in finance and labor relations. In his first job after graduation, Frank recalls, he was a "management consultant in the pre-reengineering era. That means efficiency analyses and then firing lots of people — no sugar-coated euphemisms that dress up consulting today."

Today, Frank is president of Executive Communications Group (ECG), an established, international communications consulting and training firm founded 25 years ago and based in Englewood, N.J. Frank works with clients around the world, from the big multinationals to startups, as well as government agencies and professional associations. His organization also has an established practice among the world's major pharmaceutical companies and emerging biotech companies, offering a wide range of services, including development of strategy and supporting content, presentation development and delivery, management and leadership coaching, and editorial and design services. On the training side, the firm offers group and one-on-one training programs leading to more effective communication and presentation skills.

Frank came to his current position when he realized he was most happy while interacting with or helping other people, not when poring over data in analysis. This led him to look for more humanistic applications of consulting. He says, "Finding Executive Communications Group was serendipity because I didn't know this type of firm or specialty even existed."

In his current role, Frank has realized many professionally rewarding experiences, especially in those instances when his work has had a significant impact on humankind. "We have a substantial practice at ECG as consultants to pharmaceutical executives and researchers as well as to scientists from around the world. Over the past 12 years, I've worked closely with these clients, at the

forefront in the war on so many diseases that still pose enormous challenges. I've been able to help our clients rally support for their work on HIV/AIDS, and thereby to help in some tangible way to change the face of AIDS from a death sentence to a survivable chronic disease."

His advice to today's future consulting executives? "People are so intent on becoming expert in their field quickly that they become great technicians without acquiring interpersonal, management or leadership skills. English proficiency, cultural literacy, emotional IQ and communication skills are more

sorely lacking today than ever in my lifetime. Anything you can do to build a background in these areas, when coupled with a humanistic and helpful personality, will make you a great candidate for our field."

Frank credits Jim Davis '76, Ron Martignoni '77 and Ray Stahl '77 with leading him to become a brother. Asking, "What is your fondest memory of being a SigEp?" is like asking him which of his children is his favorite! Among the memories: initiating William "Jack" Shores '80, Mr. Marshall's retirement dinner, the first volleyball marathon for CHOP, surviving Divinity School and the SigEp casino that staved off bankruptcy for the chapter.

Frank notes, "The history of Penn Delta is in our stories. I would hope that we begin to record many of them now before they fade away. Sometimes the small ones are the most poignant. I remember when I was chapter president and under a lot of pressure (inappropriate from our view) from national. Out of desperation, I called the highest-profile, most powerful alumnus I could think of. I called Bob Dunlap '31, who was chairman of Sun Oil Company at the time. Not only did we get through to him because of Penn Delta, but he came to lunch at 3902 ASAP to hear the whole situation and to prepare himself to intervene on our behalf.

"He did that quite successfully. But the amazing part of the story relates to the fact that we had not alerted the rest of the house to his coming. At lunch, Bob grabbed a plate and got in line with us in the kitchen like any other brother. I said to Mr. Marshall, whose back was turned to us, that we had a visitor he might like to meet. Mr. Marshall wheeled around in his trademark style, looked once, twice, squinted and said, 'Bobby Dunlap, I haven't seen you since, oh, 1930!' It was one of the few times Mr. Marshall was wrong. He hadn't seen him since 1931. The year was 1976 and more than 600 brothers later. That's why we had to make Mr. Marshall an honorary brother before he retired. Penn Deltas always remember and take care of their own!"

Logging over 200,000 miles a year in job-related air travel has left Frank little time for his golfing exploits, though he manages time for wine tasting, a portable hobby he heartily recommends. During the winter when he travels less, Frank directs a local youth basketball league for grades three through eight, with nine teams and two cheerleading squads. Frank has been married to the former Betty Stahl, Penn '79 (Kappa Delta), for the past 22 years. They have three children: Kate, 18, a freshman at Trinity College in Hartford, Conn.; Frank, 15; and Christopher, 11.
