## Report from Penn's Public Service Internship Program

The Penn Program for Public Service had another great summer internship program this year. For the fifth year running, the SigEp house at 4028 Walnut Street helped develop the unique sense of community and collaborative work that the program strives to cultivate. Interns enjoyed many great group dinners in the house, featuring intern family recipes ranging from Armenian to Italian. The new carpeting in the chapter house arranged by **Jim Hughes '52** was a welcomed amenity!

Each year, student interns working with Penn's Center for Community Partnerships (CCP) identify real world problems in West Philadelphia that they work to help solve.

A number of interns worked toward strengthening the new school-based school and community health promotion disease prevention program at Sayre High School (58th and Walnut). Beginning in the late fall of 2002, the CCP in partnership with eight of the university's schools including Arts and Sciences, Medicine, Nursing, Dental and Education, and the Sayre school community have been developing a comprehensive program to align the health resources of the university to better meet the community's needs in West Philadelphia.

This year's students significantly ad-

vanced the level and quality of undergraduate contributions to the Sayre High School program and helped teach in the only two for-credit science inquiry-based summer programs offered in the entire district.

A large group of intern-artists collaborated to develop arts partnerships to address the lack of opportunities for public school students to learn in and through the arts.

Two other interns worked with a small group of middle school students to produce a summer camp newsletter chronicling the happenings of the multi-faceted program.

And one intern worked closely with the Communities of Faith program here to create and cultivate partnerships with local mosques.

Clearly, each student made important contributions to the work of the Center for Community Partnerships. Many of the interns continue to work on their projects through the school year, some in partnership with the dozens of students who enroll in a similar, yet less intensive, seminar during the school year.

**Editor's note:** Due to the damage that occurs each summer to fraternity and sorority houses, Penn requires chapter houses to either be closed for the summer or

to be rented out to a specific university group. Any rent received is to be used by the chapter and the alumni board to enhance the fraternity. The alumni board wishes to thank Deirdra Stockman of Penn's CCP for her support of SigEp over the past five years. The board hopes this collaboration will continue for many years.

## First Penn Delta SigEp To Greece

**Jon Pomeroy '05**, last year's Balanced Man Scholarship chair, was one of 14 undergrads chosen by Richmond (out of over 100 applicants) to participate in the Fraternity's Balanced Man Quest to Greece this summer.

Jon's selection was announced at our Carlson Leadership Academy (formerly called Regionals) in Jersey City in February along with that of now National Board of Directors Student Member Matt Rodrigue from our University of Maine chapter.

Jon and his fellow Questers met in Chicago in June for orientation. There, he met the two faculty mentors, Professor Miriam Pittenger and her husband Laurence, as well as five alumni mentors, which included Sigma Phi Epsilon Educational Foundation Chairman Garry Kief and our own **Conrad Eberstein '65**.

The 2003 Quest to Greece was the fourth such trip sponsored by the Educational Foundation and was the first one which SigEp organized (as opposed to piggybacking on an already-organized program developed by the University of North Carolina).

"I couldn't believe the caliber of the participants and the scope of what we all did," Jon said. "First, we had brothers from all over the country, from many different types of schools and from every background you could imagine. And, second, we visited many sites which had a direct bearing on the motivating concepts of our fraternity."

"For instance, we visited the Agora in Athens where Socrates spoke and we read what Plato wrote about the Socratic dialogues on Virtue. Our discussions, with our professors as well as with

each other, deepened my appreciation for SigEp and its aspirations for us all."

"The Quest was certainly Diligent as we explored the Parthenon and its museum, the Ancient Mysteries of Greece at Eleusis and Delphi. And reading Aristotle's essay on Friendship certainly brought Brotherly Love into sharp focus," Jon added. "We even staged a rite of passage at Delphi for our Yale brother Jacob Mullins which was incredibly moving. I'll never forget that."

"The most important thing for me was the connection I made with so many brothers. I wish our entire chapter could go on a similar Quest and see what this kid from South Philly saw and experienced."

"I hope many future members of the chapter will take advantage of this and other very good programs offered by Richmond. To have visited Greece, to have seen important places which reflect many of the principles which guide our fraternity today, was one of the most enduring contributions the fraternity made to me. I'll never forget it, and I hope in the future to pay back over and over."

"It's great to be a SigEp!"
