Bill Schilling '66 will retire from his position of Director of Student Aid on June 30. Bill has worked for Student Financial Services at Penn since 1970 and has been the Director of Student Aid since 1980.

While serving in this position, Bill made countless improvements to Penn's student aid program including creating a no-loan financial aid program, implementation of a net-price financial aid calculator and increasing Penn's endowment from less than four percent

of undergraduate grants to more than twenty percent.

After retiring, Bill plans to spend more time traveling with his wife and may continue to remain in Student Financial Services in a part time role.

“I Would Do It Over Again in a Second”

Thanks to **Salvador Brau '67** for participating in this Q&A.

Why did you join SigEp as an undergraduate? I pledged SigEp because they appeared to be more interested in the overall college experience, including community service and academics, than the other fraternities that were only interested in partying.

What is the funniest memory from your SigEp days? The funniest thing, many years later, was the result of a prank. On a cold February night, at 1 a.m., I opened all the windows of the main floor of the house where the thermostat was. This led to superheating of all the bedrooms upstairs waking up all the brothers in a bath of sweat. Since I was a known prankster, they all congregated in my bedroom, stripped me down to my underwear and put me outside in the snow. The campus cops found me trying to get back into the house and got them to take me back in before I froze my butt off. Like I said, it's funny now.

What is the single fondest memory you have shared/will share with your children and grandchildren? The fondest memory is that of being a waiter at dinner for one year during which time I developed a very close relationship with Mr. Marshall. Getting to know that wise man was worth the tuition.

How do you stay connected with your brothers as an alumnus? Unfortunately, I moved to Puerto Rico for four years and then to NYC for six, then moved to California in 1977 and I have not been in personal contact with anyone since graduation except for a visit from **Brett Danko** who came out to L.A. some

years ago on a fundraising tour.

Have you visited Penn since graduation? Why or why not? I visited Penn six years ago when I was in Philadelphia for a convention but I was unable to visit the House. I just don't go back east that much and when I do I go to NY where my wife is from.

What about your membership in SigEp makes you the most proud? I'm proud to be a SigEp because of the good work we did while I was there in my undergraduate years. The house usually led all houses in academic average and had excellent community service programs that not too many of the other houses had. We also had a speakers program that helped promote better relations with the University.

How would your life be different today if you had never joined Sig Ep? I don't think my life would be much different today if I had not been a Sig Ep, but the experiences I had there, establishing close relationships with others of different backgrounds, has helped me in my interpersonal relationships through the years.

If you could go back and relive one moment from your Sig Ep years, what would it be and why? I don't know if I would want to relive the moment, but the most touching experience was the day in the fall when one of the brothers, who had had an episode of meningitis the semester before, which had caused blindness, returned as a full time student. There were bittersweet tears of joy when he returned to us.

Where has life taken you since graduation? What's new in your

life today? Since graduation, I went to medical school then did a residency in General and Vascular Surgery at The Mount Sinai Hospital in New York. I was then offered a position in private practice in the Los Angeles area where I have been since 1977.

Who do you stay connected with in your alumni years? Are there any brothers you've lost touch with whom you'd like to reconnect? I have not stayed connected personally because of where I live. I do stay in touch by reading the *Delta Penn* regularly. I also like to contribute financially when I can as I did when the need arose for the new house. I think that those who live closer to the house have a better opportunity to stay “connected” and should. So even though I am far away I still know what is going on and that gives me a sense of belonging to something that through relationships and camaraderie, while there, helped form my adult personality.

Why would you encourage other brothers to engage with Sig Ep in their alumni years? I was very happy at 3909 for the two years I lived there. We had fun and good parties, we had good sports activities (I was on the bowling team and also won the inter-fraternity Ping-Pong championship in singles and also in doubles with my roommate, **Jim Spendiff '65**, who won the pool crown), we participated in the Greek activities at the University, we did good community work but most of all we developed friendships and relationships that are memorable. I would do it over again in a second.

Donald Zeigler '43

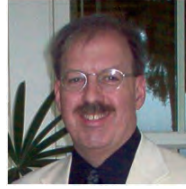

Chapter Eternal

SigEp Mourns the Loss of Brothers

Fellow SigEp brothers have unfortunately informed us of the passing of the following alumni who have entered the Chapter Eternal. They will be missed and remembered...

Reverend Kenneth Klingerman '54

He was senior pastor at Salem Evangelical and Reformed Church in St. Charles, MO for 20 years. Ken was a very nice member at 3909 Spruce, but because of his deep religious convictions, he was not really "into" the party scene and the chug-a-lug games; an earnest young man.

Judge James White '51

Jim was one of the really good guys at our house, and went on to be a New York Supreme Court judge (as you know, in NY the Supreme Courts are the courts of original jurisdiction and not the courts of final appeal).

Thomas Gilson Sr. '52

From northeast Philadelphia, Thomas was an assistant D.A. who prosecuted welfare fraud and helped create a program that gave first time offenders a second chance. He died in March of heart failure at his home. After gradu-

ating from Penn in '52, Gilson served in the Marine Corps at bases in the Mediterranean and in Camp LeJeune, N.C. He then went on to Law School at Temple University. One of his five surviving sons, Mark Gilson, said of him, "he did not have a reputation as a hard-hearted prosecutor. He was a genuinely nice guy."

Thomas is also survived by one daughter, 14 grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.
